



Phonics in formation for parents November 2021

What is phonics?

➢A system of teaching and learning letters by focussing on the sound and how these are represented by letters (graphemes)

Research has shown good phonics = good reading, writing and spelling. (Although there are other ways and children may not rely on phonics to read and spell).

Children are taught to produce the sounds as shortly as possible, e.g no 'uh' on the end of 'd' and 'g'.

Phonics screening Autumn 2, usually at the end of Yr1. If the expected result is not achieved they will be rescreened at the end of the year. Results will then be shared with parents.

Technical language

Phoneme – the sound of a letter or group of letters makes

Grapheme – the representation of the sound on paper

Digraph – 2 letters representing 1 phoneme e.g. sh ar

Trigraph – 3 letter representing 1 phoneme e.g ear air

Vowel digraph ai ee igh oa oo

Letters and Sounds: Phase 2

>19 phonemes and graphemes

Blend and segment

Tricky words (words which are not phonetically decodable)

no new phonemes – application in longer words/consonant clusters eg: gr sl cr

Blending of letters- eg: spr, thr, str

Alternative graphemes to represent previously learnt sounds. eg ai(rain) ay(day) a-e (make) Learning to make the best guess at what graphemes are used to make the sound that is heard in the word.

Phase 5 tricky wordscouldohaskedtheir

Mr. Mrs. people

looked called

Reading at home

Children will take 2 reading books and 1 non fiction book to share each week

This book should be read, re-read and talked about.

This could include asking questions, echo reading, adult role modelling reading with expression.
