small intestine	Part of the intestine where nutrients are absorbed by the body.		Premolars — Humans have 8 premolars, two in each quarter of the mouth. They are between the canine tooth and the molars. They hold and crushes food.
large intestine	Part of the intestine where water is absorbed from remaining waste food. Stools are formed in the large intestine.	Canine Molars Premolars	Incisors — Humans have 8 incisors altogether; 4 in the upper jaw and 4 in the lower jaw. Their function is to bite and cut food.
rectum	Part of the digestive system where stools are stored before leaving the body through the anus.	Incisors Wisdom Teeth	To help prevent tooth decay you shouldn't eat or drink too much sugary food, brush your teeth twice a day and visit the dentist.



Digestion happens in the digestive system. This is a series of organs that break the food down so it can be absorbed. into our bloodstream




Food Chain

A food chain shows how plants and animals get their energy.

A food chain always starts with a **producer**.

A living thing that eats other plants and animals is called a consumer.

Animals can be put into groups based on the types of food they eat. Some animals called carnivores only eat meat.

Others are called 'herbivores'. They only eat plants. Animals that eat meat and plants are called `omnivores´.
