


Banana, Banana, Banana! Sarah Finan (author / illustrator)




The Wild Robot on the Island Peter Brown (author)

A crumbling villa. A mythical maze. A race against time. Netta's summer in Crete with her history-obsessed brother Remy is anything but exciting—until vivid dreams pull her into Ancient Greece. There, King Minos readies his labyrinth, and whispers of a monster grow louder. As Netta slips further into the past, her grip on the present weakens. She and Remy must uncover what's drawing her back before it's too late—because if they fail, Netta might be lost to history forever. This thrilling time-travel adventure blends myth, mystery, and a bold feminist twist on Greek legend. Suitable for confident readers in Years 5 and 6.

Sir Lenny Henry - Sir Lenny Henry has risen from being a star on children's television to becoming one of Britain's best known comedians, but now spends a lot of his time writing for children! The *Boy with Wings* was his first book and was written only a few years ago. In that time, the exciting and funny book series has really taken off; there are a number of Lenny Henry

books already in our library – go take a look! The second in the series, *The Book of Legends* was released last year. Both of the books are only 250 pages long so easily accessible for less-confident readers!



Olympus and the Lost Hero

Olympus and the Lost Hero by Rick Riordan Seven Heroes. One Prophecy. Destiny Calls. When Jason, Piper and Leo crash land at Camp Half-Blood, they have no idea what to expect. A haven for the children of the Greek Gods, like the famous Percy Jackson, they are apparently safe here – despite the monsters roaming the woods. But before they can settle into their new lives as

demigods, the trio are thrown into a quest – to rescue Hera, Queen of the Gods, from the clutches of a terrifying enemy... "A great book that I wouldn't hestitate to recommend.
