

Key Vocabulary.	
Equator	An imaginary line around the middle of a planet. It is halfway between the North Pole and the South Pole.
Northern Hemisphere	An equator divides the planet into a Northern Hemisphere and a Southern Hemisphere
Southern Hemisphere	
Town	A town is a human settlement. Towns are generally larger than villages and smaller than cities.
County	A county is a geographical region of a country.
Human Features	Human geography relates only to the human environment, something that is built by humans and would not have existed in nature without humans
Physical features	A natural feature on the surface, such as water, mountains, and deserts.
The Black Country	The Black Country is an area of the West Midlands county covering Dudley, Sandwell and some parts of Walsall and Wolverhampton.

Halesowen

Halesowen is a town in the Borough of Dudley, in the county of West Midlands, England.
It is considered as one of the largest towns in the United Kingdom without a railway station.

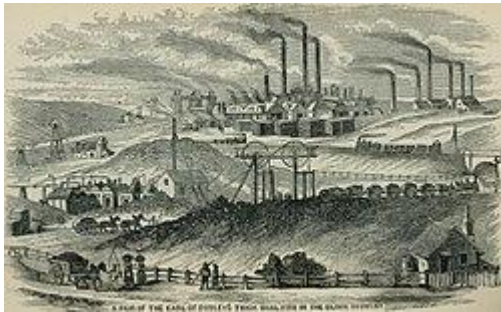

The Black Country

The Black Country is an area of the West Midlands county, in the United Kingdom covering most of the Metropolitan Boroughs of Dudley, Sandwell, and only some minor parts of Walsall and Wolverhampton. Dudley and Tipton are generally considered to be the centre.



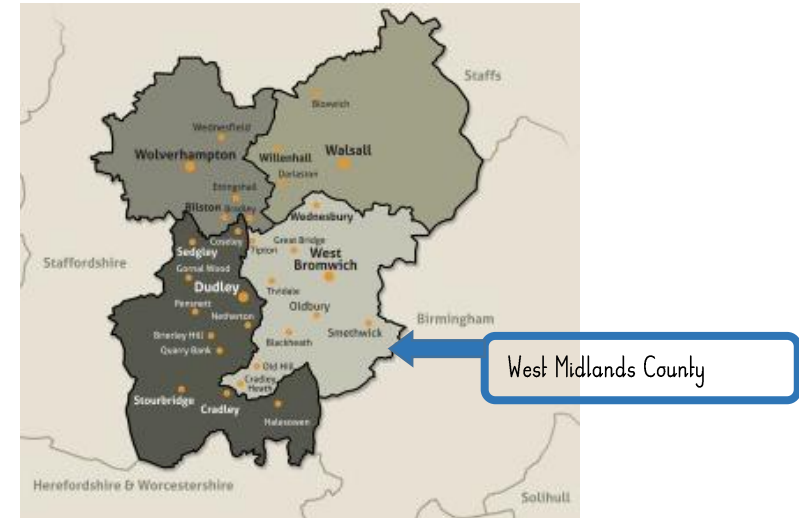
It became industrialised in the Industrial Revolution, with coal mines, coking, iron foundries, glass factories, brickworks and steel mills, producing a high level of air pollution.

Physical Features

A dark seam of coal is clearly visible on the sides of Doultons Clay Pit, in Saltwells Wood to the south of Netherton.
