creator of the universe and of everything in the universe, (3) Brahman is eternal and (4) Brahman has no beginning and no end) <u>LO: To name some gods and goddesses that many Hindus believe in.</u> (- including Shiva, Sita, Vishnu and avatars of Vishnu including Rama and Krishna.) <u>LO: to share thoughts about Hindu beliefs</u> (children to share thoughts about the Hindu belief in many gods and goddesses)	<u>Jesus is both God and human.</u> (Look at nativity scenes where artists present Jesus as both God and human.) <u>LO: To raise questions and recall answers about how Christmas is celebrated.</u> <u>LO: To recall answers about the Nativity Story.</u> (E.g How does the Nativity story show kindness?) <u>LO: To share what we believe in or value most.</u> (religious or non-religious view)	<u>LO: To know why Muhammad is 'The Messenger of God'.</u> <u>LO: To compare Muslim and Christian beliefs.</u> (Muhammad and Jesus) <u>LO: To reflect on the key Muslim beliefs about Muhammad.</u>	<u>LO: To understand and share views about the Christian belief in eternal life.</u> <u>LO: To reflect on the Christian belief of 'new life'.</u> (Daffodil bulb analogy) <u>LO: To recall answers about the Easter story.</u>	<u>LO: To describe the story of Muhammad's first revelation.</u> <u>LO: To know that the Qur'an is a collection of revelations.</u> (The revelations were collected after Muhammad's death and made into the Qur'an.) <u>LO: To share thoughts about revelations within the Qur'an'</u> (Looking at and talking about extracts)	<u>LO: To know that the belief in God or Gods is not shared by all.</u> (Some people believe in one God, many Gods, no Gods, or uncertain- allow children to share their views.) <u>LO: To know that humanism is a non-religious worldview.</u> <u>LO: To name and identify a Humanist symbol.</u>
