





***Hare's New Dress* Julia Donaldson (Author), Axel Scheffler (Illustrator)**



***All About Antarctica (Hardback)* Marc Martin (author)**








***The Snow Girl* Sophie Anderson (author), Melissa Castrillon (illustrator)**
